Kia Ora,

We are making a few changes that will affect your kerbside recycling collection. From the 31st May we'll only be accepting plastics 1, 2 and 5 in your kerbside recycling wheelie bins.

To check if your plastic is recyclable, look for the number 1, 2, or 5 in a triangle on the bottom of the item.

This can also help you avoid buying nonrecyclable items, or swap for items that do come in recyclable packaging. Clean cardboard, paper, tins, cans and glass will still be collected.
